Volunteers Needed

Boyanup School is on the *look out* for volunteers who are interested in supporting our students at school. We will be teaming up with EdConnect who will support our school to recruit, train and support volunteers to provide life changing mentoring or learning support to students who may be disadvantaged or at-risk, providing them the opportunity for educational success and improved wellbeing.

There will be two different volunteering roles available:

- 1. **Mentoring** A student is matched with a mentor and works one-on-one with the same student for 1 hour a week, outside the classroom. The key role as a mentor is developing a relationship with the student supporting them with academics or on their social and emotional wellbeing.
- 2. **Learning Support** Volunteers work under the guidance of education staff. Some of the tasks may include assisting in the classroom, kitchen, garden projects, gardening and library. Learning support volunteers can also help with classroom projects and special events for the school.

Volunteers may have specific skills they like to share with their students, enriching the learning and support experience.

This means that schools have ongoing campaigns and programs to teach children and young people the knowledge and skills they need to prevent bullying and other inappropriate behaviours they see online, to intervene effectively when incidents occur, to celebrate diversity, and to promote friendship and positive social behaviours. Common cybersafety issues for children include cyberbullying, accessing or sharing inappropriate content and protecting their personal information.



Parents are sometimes unsure of where to start when it comes to parental controls and what information they need to know about. The safety commissioner has an excellent website with easy to read information. The section for parents has a range of resources where you can learn about the digital environment that your child has access to and how to support your child to have safe and enjoyable online experiences.


