Boyanup School Emergency Management Plan

In emergencies, schools need to have at hand, practical information about actions that guide response and aid recovery in order to:

- · ensure the safety of all persons on the school site
- . ensure a supportive, caring response that considers the mental health needs of all members of the school community
- · return to normality as soon as possible
- enable continuation of school routine and an optimal learning environment
- · minimise the adverse effects of such an event on the school community.



Schools need to take action to prepare for and prevent emergencies and critical incidents. Boyanup School has recently reviewed and amended our Emergency and Critical Incident Management Policy which includes an updated Evacuation and Lock Down set of procedures.

In an event where students are evacuated, every attempt will be made to communicate with our families to ensure they are aware of the situation, and where the children have been mustered for their safety. In most cases, the evacuation point is in the centre of the adjoining school oval.

However, if there is a bush fire, the children will be mustered to the Library, where further instructions from authorities will advise if we will need to evacuate the school site to an external site (Boyanup Hugh Kilpatrick Hall).

Communication to families will be conducted through SMS messages, phone and/or local radio. A copy of the Emergency and Critical Incident Management Policy, including full evacuation and lock down procedures are available from the office.

School Board Vacancy






