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Protective Behaviours for Students

Within the Health and Physical Education learning area of the Western Australian Curriculum, a significant part of the curriculum is teaching students about Protective Behaviours. The Department of Education provides resources to teachers which encourages the development of skills so that students continue to be kept safe in our community.

Protective Behaviours Education focuses on developing the skills of empowerment, communication, self-esteem, resilience, social skills, and other life skills to prevent abuse, reduce violence and promote life-enriching rather than life-depleting experiences. It encourages students to:

- **Assert** their right to feel safe
- **Listen** to what their body tells them
- **Follow up** by taking action to either solve problems on their own or to seek assistance from other people.



Everybody has the right to feel safe at all times!

At Boyanup Primary School, we use a whole school approach which extends the learning environment from what is taught inside the classroom to how students' well-being is supported outside the classroom. This type of approach is commonly recognised as characterising a health promoting school.

Jump Rope for Heart

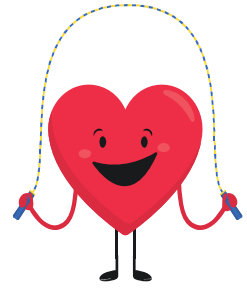
We're skipping through the Term!
