Long Hair at School

There are many reasons why all students with longer hair should tie their hair back when attending school. Longer hair is identified as hair that is longer than shoulder length or long enough to tie back.


The recent warm weather has meant that students return to class very hot after playing at recess and lunchtime. If their hair is not tied back, it can make them even hotter.

Another reason is tidiness. All students look very smart in their Boyanup Primary School uniforms and having neat

hair compliments how they look. By tying your hair back, you can also prevent it from becoming entangled and keep it in place, thus reducing the risk of damage. This will also help to keep your hair healthy and strong.

A very important reason however is the issue of headlice. Headlice can spread only by direct, hair-to-hair contact. If students have long, loose hair, they can migrate easily to new heads; if hair is neatly tied back, it's much less likely to happen.



At Boyanup Primary School, we require all students to tie their hair back. It positively promotes our School Expectations of 'Being Respectful' and 'Being Caring & Safe'.
