At Boyanup Primary School all students have the right to...

Our Good Standing Strategy supports our school values of Endeavour, Integrity, and Achievement.

It is reinforced by our Positive Behaviour Support Program which explicitly reinforces and teaches being an *Active Learner*; being *Responsible*; being *Caring & Safe* and being *Respectful*.

To have and keep Good Standing, students must follow these agreements:

- Maintain regular attendance – above 89%.
- Wear school uniform and follow the school dress code.
- Keep ICT agreements.
- Demonstrate our agreed school Behaviour Expectations.

Student Responsibilities

- It is the responsibility of each student to maintain their Good Standing to be able to be included in non-curricular and social activities. Students with Good Standing are eligible for Good Standing rewards as part of our PBS process.
- Students who lose their Good Standing will lose the privilege to participate in various non-curricular events throughout the school year, during the period in which they have lost, or are working to regain their Good Standing.
- Student leaders may have their leadership role withdrawn for a period if they lose their Good Standing.

Teacher Actions to support student behaviour.

Students are supported by teacher actions to address the behaviour, encouraging the student to choose the expected behaviour.

Step 1: Low key responses (CMS) these responses can be positive e.g. Bee slip

Step 2: Student conference – low key.

Step 3: Explicit teaching of skill deficit

Step 4: Partner room referral/parent notification – written reflection to be completed.

Step 5: Minor Behaviour Slip placed in green file which is handed in to administration each Monday at morning meeting.

Step 6: If a student receives 4 slips of the same behaviour, administration intervene.

Students will lose their Good Standing if:

- They receive 4 minor behaviour slips within a week.
- They are suspended due to an act of, or the promotion of, an act of violence.
- They do not uphold the Good Standing agreements or our school values.

Regaining Good Standing status:

Students are provided with the opportunity to regain Good Standing after demonstrating positive behaviour change over a specific period of time. This will vary according to the reason for loss of Good Standing, age of the student or developmental understanding. School staff will advise parents/guardians when this occurs, along with feedback to the student.

Severity Clause

- Students will automatically lose the privilege to participate in activities where the safety of themselves or other students is a concern.
- Students who are involved in a 'one off' severe behavior incident in the classroom or playground will automatically lose their 'Good Standing'.
